SUBJECT: ACTIONS RELATED TO THE PURCHASE ORDER WITH GOLDEN BAY CONSTRUCTION, INC. FOR SPEED HUMPS INSTALLATIONS			
RECOMMENDATION:			
<p>Adopt a resolution authorizing the City Manager or her designee to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) Execute a purchase order with Golden Bay Construction, Inc. (Hayward, CA) for speed hump installations for a one-year term beginning on or about July 1, 2024, and ending on or about June 30, 2025, for a not-to-exceed amount of \$400,000; and b) Exercise up to six one-year options to extend the term of the purchase order with the last option ending on or about June 30, 2031, subject to the appropriation of funds. 			
BASIS FOR RECOMMENDATION:			
<p>The Department of Transportation requires services for the installation of speed humps on City streets to enhance safety for pedestrians, cyclists, and motorists. Speed humps and other traffic calming initiatives are designed to curtail vehicle speeds, diminish the likelihood of collisions, and to ensure safety for road users. Through the installation of speed humps and other traffic calming initiatives, the Department of Transportation's objective is to cultivate responsible driving practices and advance the overall safety of City communities.</p> <p>In March 2024, a competitive Request for Bids was released by the Finance Department to procure these services. The Request for Bids provisioned for a one-year initial term and an additional six one-year options for the City to extend the term. One responsive bid was submitted, and no protests were received. Staff recommends award to Golden Bay Construction, Inc. as the sole responsive, and responsible bidder pursuant to the bidding procedures of the San José Municipal Code, Section 4.12.310B(1). Approval of this recommendation ensures the City receives these essential services.</p> <p>Commission Recommendation/Input: There is no commission recommendation or input associated with this action.</p>			
COST AND FUNDING SOURCE:			
<p>Funding for these costs have been programmed as part of the 2024-2025 Proposed Capital Budget under the Safety - Pedestrian Improvements appropriation in the Traffic Capital program. This funding is programmed as part of the ongoing appropriation.</p>
