- Overview of the jurisdiction's approach
- Identifies global emergency response policies
- Describes the response and recovery organization
- Assigns specific roles and responsibilities to City departments, agencies, and community partners

# How was the plan updated?

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


- Witt O'Brien's Consulting firm
- Review of multiple After Action Reports
- Review of County and State Plan
- Workshops with City staff and outside stakeholders
- 31 workshops with over 30 revisions
- 20 City Offices/Departments and over 20 external stakeholders

# How does the plan work?

- Assigns specific roles and responsibilities to City departments, agencies, and community partners
- Specifies the organization of response
- Identifies how all are engaged and collaborate during an emergency
- Describes the Emergency Management Organization, and its relation to other organizations
