**SUBJECT: STATE GRANT AND PAYMENT APPLICATIONS FOR CALRECYCLE PROGRAMS**

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Adopt a resolution authorizing the City Manager or her designee, for a period of five years, beginning March 5, 2024 through March 5, 2029, to submit grant and payment applications to the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery and enter into grant and payment agreements with the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery if the agreements are within the City Manager’s existing City Council-designated contracting authority.

**BASIS FOR RECOMMENDATION:**

California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) offers funding opportunities, authorized by legislation, to assist public and private entities in the safe and effective management of the waste stream. To apply for these funding opportunities, CalRecycle requires all grant applicants to adopt a resolution that authorizes specific grant and payment-related matters. Adoption of the resolution is needed to comply with this requirement.

If adopted, the resolution authorizes the City Manager or her designee to submit proposals to CalRecycle, state the period of time the authorization is valid; and state the person authorized to execute grant and payment-related documents. The City Council approved a similar resolution, No. 78815, in 2018 that expired in October 2023. Resolution No. 78815 will be superseded if the resolution is adopted.

CalRecycle offers many different grant and payment programs. Within the next five years, the City intends to apply for some of these grants, including:

- Beverage Container Recycling;
- Greenhouse Gas Reduction;
- Household Hazardous Waste;
- Solid Waste Disposal and Site Cleanup (these include illegal dumping mitigation funds);
- Tire Recycling, Cleanup, and Enforcement;
- Used Oil Recycling;
- Recycling Market Development Zone, Zone Incentive Funds; and,
- Local Enforcement Agency.
