RECOMMENDATION

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SUMMARY AND OUTCOME

The increase in Library Parcel Tax rates will continue to provide funding to maintain and enhance Citywide library services and facilities through the acquisition of materials, development and delivery of education and digital literacy programs, and to repair, equip, and staff libraries.

BACKGROUND

In August 2004, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 72268 placing a Library Parcel Tax, as provided in the San José Library and Reading Protection Ordinance, on the November 2004 general municipal election ballot. The Library Parcel Tax was approved by the required two-thirds vote of the electorate. The Library Parcel Tax took effect on July 1, 2005, with an expiration date of June 30, 2015.

In August 2005, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 72844, approving the placement of the Library Parcel Tax on the fiscal year 2005-2006 Santa Clara County Property Tax Roll. Library Parcel Tax rates for fiscal year 2005-2006 were set at the same rates that had been charged through the Library Benefit Assessment District: \$25 per single-family or condominium/townhome parcel, and varying rates for other residential, industrial, and vacant parcels.

In March 2014, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 76935, placing a 25-year extension of the existing Library Parcel Tax on the June 2014 special municipal election ballot. The Library Parcel Tax was approved by the required two-thirds vote of the electorate. The passage of the measure extends the Library Parcel Tax for the period beginning July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2040.

Per the San José Library and Reading Protection Ordinance (Chapter 4.79 of the San José Municipal Code), commencing with fiscal year 2006-2007 and by resolution of the City Council, the City Council may increase the Library Parcel Tax rates if the City Council finds that the cost of living in the City of San José as shown on the Consumer Price Index (CPI) has increased over the preceding base period, but in no event shall the increase exceed 3.00%. The base period for calculating the CPI adjustment is the February to February reporting period. The specific CPI required to be used for the calculation is the All Urban Consumers for the San Francisco-Oakland-San José area, with all items included as published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics. The Bureau of Labor Statistics discontinued the San Francisco-Oakland-San José index in 2018. Starting in fiscal year 2019-2020, the Finance Department has used the Bureau of Labor Statistics San Francisco-Oakland-Hayward CPI index to calculate the Library Parcel Tax cost of living adjustment, as the geographical area covered by this index is comparable to San José.

Table 1 below shows the last 10 years of annually approved percentage increases for the Library Parcel Tax per Chapter 4.79 of the San José Municipal Code.

ANALYSIS

Following the methodology used since fiscal year 2006-2007 for the CPI adjustment to the Library Parcel Tax rate, staff recommends an increase of 2.37% for fiscal year 2024-2025. Specifically, as outlined in **Table 2** below, the CPI for All Urban Consumers for the San Francisco-Oakland-Hayward area, as published by the United States Department of Labor

Bureau of Labor Statistics, increased by 2.37% during the period from February 2023 to February 2024.

The proposed 2.37% increase in the Library Parcel Tax rate will increase the Library Parcel Tax for a single-family or condominium/townhome parcel from \$39.11 for fiscal year 2023-2024 to \$40.03 for fiscal year 2024-2025, reflecting an increase of \$0.92 per parcel. The complete Library Parcel Tax schedule is **attached** to this memorandum (Exhibit – Library Parcel Tax Rates – FY 2023-2024 Actual and FY 2024-2025 Proposed Library Tax Rates). The exhibit shows the current tax schedule and the proposed tax schedule to be placed on the Santa Clara County Property Tax Roll for fiscal year 2024-2025 for all types of parcels. Assuming the same land use classifications and number of parcels as in fiscal year 2023-2024, the approximate tax collection for all land use classifications in fiscal year 2024-2025 will be approximately \$11.0 million, reflecting an increase of approximately \$250,000 over the fiscal year 2023-2024 collections of approximately \$10.7 million.

The collection of the Library Parcel Tax for fiscal year 2024-2025 represents the tenth year of the extended 25 year term of the Library Parcel Tax scheduled to end on June 30, 2040. Currently, the Library Parcel Tax provides approximately 17% of the San José Public Library System's 2023-2024 Operating Budget and 2% of the 2023-2024 Capital Budget.

EVALUATION AND FOLLOW-UP

The Library Parcel Tax is adjusted each year based on the CPI. No follow-up is required.

BUDGET REFERENCE

The Fiscal Year 2024-2025 Proposed Operating Budget includes the estimated increase of 2.37% in revenue for Library Parcel Tax. Additional details can be found in the Library Parcel Tax Source and Use of Funds on page 870 of the 2024-2025 Proposed Operating Budget.

**A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
SAN JOSE APPROVING THE INCREASED LIBRARY
PARCEL TAX RATES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024-2025 BY
2.37% OVER THE FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024 RATES AND
APPROVING THE PLACEMENT OF THE LIBRARY
PARCEL TAX ON THE FISCAL YEAR 2024-2025 SANTA
CLARA COUNTY PROPERTY TAX ROLL**

WHEREAS, on August 3, 2004, the City Council (“City Council”) of the City of San José (“City”) adopted Resolution No. 72268, placing a ten (10) year Library Parcel Tax, as provided in the San José Library and Reading Protection Ordinance (Chapter 4.79 of the San José Municipal Code), on the November 2, 2004 General Municipal Election ballot, which was approved; and

WHEREAS, the Library Parcel Tax took effect on July 1, 2005 with an expiration date of June 30, 2015 and provides funding to maintain and enhance Citywide library services and facilities; and

WHEREAS, on March 4, 2014, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 76935 placing an extension of the existing Library Parcel Tax on the June 3, 2014 Special Municipal Election ballot, which was approved, extending the Library Parcel Tax for the period beginning July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2040; and

WHEREAS, beginning in August 2005, the City Council adopted the following resolutions approving the placement of the Library Parcel Tax on the Santa Clara County Property Tax Roll for each Fiscal Year (“FY”):

WHEREAS, in order for the County of Santa Clara to place the Library Parcel Tax on the FY 2024-2025 Property Tax Roll, the City Council is required to adopt a resolution approving the tax rate for FY 2024-2025; and

WHEREAS, per the San José Library and Reading Protection Ordinance, the City Council may increase the Library Parcel Tax rates if it finds that the cost of living in the City of San José as shown on the Consumer Price Index (“CPI”) has increased over the preceding Base Period, but in no event shall the increase exceed 3.0%; and

WHEREAS, currently, the Library Parcel Tax provides approximately 17% of the San José Public Library System’s Operating Budget and 2% of its Capital Budget; and

WHEREAS, following the methodology used since FY 2006 – 2007 for the CPI adjustment to the Library Parcel Tax rate, the City recommends an increase of 2.37% for FY 2024-2025; and

WHEREAS, the complete Library Parcel Tax schedule is attached to this resolution as Exhibit A and shows the current tax schedule and the proposed tax schedule to be placed on the County Property Tax Roll for FY 2024-2025 for all types of parcels; and

WHEREAS, assuming the same land use classifications and number of parcels as in FY 2023-2024, the approximate tax collection for all land use classifications in FY 2024-2025 will be approximately \$11.0 million or an increase of approximately \$250,000 over FY 2023-2024 collections of approximately \$10.7 million; and

WHEREAS, approval of the increase in Library Parcel Tax rates will continue to provide funding to maintain and enhance City-wide library services and facilities through the acquisition of materials; the development and delivery of education and digital literacy programs; and the repair, equipping, and staffing of libraries;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN JOSE THAT:

1. Pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 4.79 of the San José Municipal Code, the City Council approves the increased Library Parcel Tax rates for FY 2024-2025 as set forth in the attached Exhibit A, including the calculation of the Consumer Price Index adjustment, as more fully described in the memorandum to this Council, presented to this Council for its meeting on June 11, 2024, from the Director of the Finance Department and the Director of the Library Department. Further, the Library Parcel Tax is to be levied on parcels of land in the City of

San José for FY 2024-2025 in accordance with the tax rate schedule for FY 2024-2025 set forth in the attached Exhibit A.

2. The City's Director of Finance shall cause a certified copy of this Resolution to be delivered to the Auditor of the County of Santa Clara for entry in the assessment book of the respective sums in dollars and cents, to be paid as established by this Resolution and Chapter 4.79 of the San José Municipal Code.
