### **Recommendation:**

Adopt a resolution to repeal Resolution 79710 and set forth the Schedule of Parking Penalties which increases the following parking violation amounts by a range of \$5-\$15 effective July 1, 2024:

- (a) Street sweeping;
- (b) Parked out of space – metered;
- (c) Expired/unpaid meter;
- (d) Failure to pay at lot;
- (e) Residential parking permit required; and
- (f) Parked in bike path/lane.

**SUBJECT: ACTIONS RELATED TO THE SCHEDULE OF PARKING PENALTIES**

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Adopt a resolution to repeal Resolution 79710 and set forth the Schedule of Parking Penalties which increases the following parking violation amounts by a range of \$5-\$15 effective July 1, 2024:

- Street sweeping;
- Parked out of space – metered;
- Expired/unpaid meter;
- Failure to pay at lot;
- Residential parking permit required; and
- Parked in bike path/lane.

**BASIS FOR RECOMMENDATION:**

During fiscal year 2022-2023, the City of San José issued at total of 189,173 parking citations Citywide. Roughly 128,000 of those citations were issued across key parking violations that impact the environment (street sweeping), quality of life (residential parking permit), economic vitality (metered parking), and safety (bike lane.)

Staff conducted a benchmark analysis of current parking violation fine amounts against other cities in Northern California (San Francisco, Oakland, Sacramento) that showed that the City’s current fine amounts were below average for the area. Additionally, as shown in the **table** below, the proposed fine amounts were last increased between the years 2011 – 2016.

\*Fine amounts include a \$12.50 court administrative and infrastructure fees that is passed on to the County/State when each citation is paid by the violator.

**BASIS FOR RECOMMENDATION CONTINUED:**

The Department of Transportation's Parking Compliance Unit focuses on obtaining compliance with parking rules and regulations through education whenever possible, however, when compliance cannot be gained voluntarily, citations are issued in an attempt to correct and change driver behavior. Typically, parking citation fine amounts are reviewed approximately every three to five years. When citation issuance data indicates that driver behavior remains unchanged and benchmarking analysis identifies that San José parking fines have remained below average, fine adjustments are considered. Rather than institute blanket increases across all violation types, recommended adjustments center around violations impacting the environment, quality of life, economic vitality, and safety.

Prior to this recommendation, fines were most recently reviewed during the COVID-19 pandemic, but adjustments were not recommended at that time and instead a parking citation amnesty program was instituted.

Staff estimates that the increase in fine amounts will generate an additional \$800,000 in collected citation revenue in fiscal year 2024-2025.

Commission Recommendation/Input: No commission recommendation or input is associated with this action.

**COST AND FUNDING SOURCE:**

There are no cost implications associated with this action. The proposed revenue increases have been incorporated into the development of the 2024-2025 Proposed Operating Budget.



**SUBJECT:** Actions Related to the Schedule of Parking Penalties

## RECOMMENDATION

Adopt a resolution to repeal Resolution 79710 and approve the staff-recommended Schedule of Parking Penalties, with an increase to the penalty for violations of CVC 21211(b), “Parked in a Bike Path/Lane,” to a proposed new fine amount of \$112.50, including the \$12.50 surcharges, effective July 1, 2024.

## BACKGROUND

Despite repeated efforts to deter chronic violations of CVC 21211(b), particularly on Lean Avenue between Blossom Hill Road and Hayes Avenue, enforcement has not meaningfully reduced the number of vehicles blocking bike lanes in District 2. Bicyclists have not been able to benefit from the protected bike lane that was constructed several years ago because vehicles continue to park in the lane. This problem is not unique to south San Jose.

A greater penalty is recommended to discourage drivers from continuing to park in bike lanes.

Additionally, we request that DOT and ESD work with the Council District 3 Office to address Downtown-specific parking concerns that affect traffic safety.

**SECTION 1. SCHEDULE OF PARKING PENALTIES**

**SECTION 2. LATE PAYMENT PENALTIES**

Late payment penalties shall be added to the Total Penalties as follows:

A one-time late payment penalty of thirty-five dollars (\$35.00) shall be added if the Total Penalty has not been paid within ten (10) days of the mailing of the notice of delinquency.

**SECTION 3. DEPARTMENT OF MOTOR VEHICLES SERVICE FEE**

A service fee for unpaid parking penalties shall be added to the Total Penalties as follows:

A one-time service fee of four dollars (\$4.00) shall be added if the Total Penalty has not been paid within forty (40) days of the notice of parking violation and a hold has been placed on the vehicle registration through the Department of Motor Vehicles. The Director of the Department of Transportation shall have the authority to make further adjustments to this service fee, between the range of one dollar (\$1.00) and ten dollars (\$10.00), corresponding with any future service fee adjustments implemented by the Department of Motor Vehicles.

**SECTION 4. CREDIT CARD SERVICE FEE**

A one-time service fee of three dollars (\$3.00) for parking penalties paid by credit card shall be added to the Total Penalties, which shall be collected by the City or by the City's Parking Citation Processing and Collection contractor, to defer the cost of processing and collecting credit card payments.

**SECTION 5. FRANCHISE TAX BOARD COLLECTION FEE**

A collection fee for unpaid parking penalties and associated late payment penalties shall be added to the Total Penalties as follows:

A one-time service fee of thirty-five percent (35%) of the Total Penalties owed shall be added if the Total Penalties have not been paid prior to the mailing of the Franchise Tax Board Pre-Intercept Notice.

**SECTION 6. SPECIAL COLLECTION FEE**

A collection fee for unpaid parking penalties and associated late payment penalties shall be added to the Total Penalties as follows:

A one-time service fee of twenty-four percent (24%) of the Total Penalties owed shall be added if the Total Penalties have not been paid prior to the mailing of the Special Collection Notice.

**SECTION 7.** Resolution No. 79710, setting forth the Schedule of Parking Penalties, effective September 15, 2020, is hereby repealed.

**SECTION 8.** The provisions of this Resolution shall be operative commencing on June 18, 2024.
