BACKGROUND

On February 1, 2005, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 72517 which requires Councilmembers to submit a memorandum to the Rules Committee regarding proposed City Council sponsored Special Events and the proposed use of any funds.

The San José Day festivities showcased the vibrant art and culture of the city, featuring a delightful array of food, vendors, and captivating performances. The Cinco de Mayo car show highlighted a display of low rider trucks, welcoming the community to enjoy beautiful sights of

lowriders. The Cinco de Mayo parade and festival in Downtown San Jose honored Mexican culture through lively performances, spirited music, and a parade procession through Downtown.

ANALYSIS

Retroactively approve by the City Council of the event will ensure compliance with the Council's prior direction regarding Council Special Events. In observance of existing fundraising disclosure requirements, Councilmember Omar Torres will report any cash or in-kind donations received for the event on their Disclosure of Fundraising Report (DFR-1). Approval of this memorandum will enable Council District 3, City departments and the Office of the City Clerk to proceed with the event. Any cash donations received will be processed pursuant to the City's normal financial and budgetary procedures.
